Based on the 12-step model of the disease concept of addiction, our philosophy is that recovery is not about morality or willpower, but rather a holistic re-organization of feelings, through behaviors. It is also our belief that alcoholism and drug addiction is a family disease, and we encourage family participation in the educational component of the program, that is directed toward the family system as a whole.

Our goal is to provide the education, structure, and support necessary for clients to build the skills and new life strategies necessary to live a physically, emotionally, and spiritually sober life, free of addiction.
